


Book Review

A Year of Biblical Womanhood: How a Liberated Woman Found Herself Sitting on Her Roof, Covering Her Head, and Calling Her Husband "Master" By Rachel Held Evans, 2012

I've always felt that some parts of the Bible were written for other people, in another place and another time. Some sections of Leviticus, for example, feel so strange that they seem completely irrelevant and hardly worth my attention. When I put on my cotton-polyester t-shirt this morning and went outside to water the many different flowers in our yard, Leviticus 19:19 didn't cross my mind. Biblical laws pertaining specifically to women feel similarly odd and outdated to my baby-boomer sensibilities. Are these laws relevant to Christians today?



In A Year of Biblical Womanhood, Rachel Held Evans documents twelve months spent living out ten admonitions to women found in scripture, in the Old and New Testaments. She explains, "Some practices I would observe just once. Others I would try to observe all year. Each month I would focus on a different virtue—gentleness, domesticity, obedience, valor, beauty, modesty, purity, fertility, submission, justice, silence, and grace."

At the time she wrote this book, Evans was a successful author; she and her husband were a two-career couple and did not yet have children. Readers will be entertained by Evans's accounts of the demands of taking on each Biblical virtue in a 21st-century suburban neighborhood. As soon as you open the book's cover, you'll see the "before and after" photos: Evans, before she began work on the book, sporting a stylish coiffure; and after the book's completion, having gone without a haircut for 368 days (1 Corinthians 11:15).

This journey is not solitary: in the course of her adventure Evans learns from a number of other women, and several men. She dives head-first into new (for her) experiences, including cooking, sewing, preparing for a Passover seder, sitting quietly through most Alabama games during football season, and "do[ing] penance on the rooftop for acts of contention." Her reflections on these experiences range from wise and tender to laugh-out-loud hilarious. Even when she finds herself at odds with the task at hand, she manages to see grace and beauty in Christians who live a particular virtue as a daily commitment to God. The brief character sketches of women from the Bible found at the end of each chapter were one of my favorite parts of this book; they led me back to the original passages of scripture with a new appreciation of these women's lives and purposes.

If this book sounds like a "chick book," ... not at all! To be sure, the focus here is on women's experiences, perspectives, and struggles in leading a sincere life of faith. The presence of Evans's ever-patient husband, Dan, in the form of his journal entries reminds the reader—and often the writer—that loving, supportive family members are an important part of any faith journey. Any reader will be guided to consider more deeply, as well, how gender shapes God's call to each of us.

Rachel Held Evans (1981-2019) was a Christian columnist, blogger, and author. She was raised in Alabama in a non-denominational Evangelical church. As an adult she became an Episcopalian and was a member of St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Cleveland, TN at the time of her death.
