Advent, Christmas, and Incarnation

This time of year with trees and lights and seasonal joy gets observed in different ways. For the church, it is not about Santa, snow, and shopping. It is Advent, a time of waiting and expectation. We light candles one-by-one on a wreath of evergreens to mark weekly the steps in time that occurred over generations. Prophets like Isaiah and seers like Daniel knew God would provide a Messiah, an Anointed One, to save us and to lead us. In that, we remember how long they hoped and how long they waited, even as we wait hopefully for a long time for the second-coming.

Waiting is not easy—whether we wait on the heavenly or the earthly.

- ~We wait with some exasperation for this pandemic to end, or to become less life-threatening, and certainly to become less divisive.
- ~Some wait on workers. Others wait on jobs.
- ~Some wait on a house to sell. Others wait on housing of any kind.
- ~We wait for justice.
- ~We wait for peace.
- ~All of this earthly waiting as we wait for the Kingdom to come.

How does this waiting take shape? When Jesus was born, it took the shape of a baby boy who grew into a teacher, a healer, the Messiah. We call that Incarnation: the Word becoming flesh. That restorative incarnation was good, just as God said, "It was good" during the days of creation. Thus we pray in thanksgiving and in hope when pondering the feast of the Incarnation (better known as Christmas).

O God, who wonderfully created and yet more wonderfully restored the dignity of human nature: Grant that we may share the divine life if him who humbled himself to share our humanity, your Son Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen. BCP 252

So, sharing the divine life with others as God shared it with us is not something we have to wait on! We have that life in Christ to share now even as we wait on the final installment in the second-coming. Whenever that is, however long we wait, we have a way to live now: a sharing. Better yet, a generous sharing of self, a humble sharing, a sharing that can be restorative. So whatever the season—Advent, Christmas or even Lent—let us wait with this Incarnational purpose—not impatiently, but purposefully as restored people of God.
