


IT'S STILL LENT

Another month, same church season. Lent. A time for 'self-examination and repentance, prayer, fasting and self-denial.' This issue of Tidings has much to do with one of those points: prayer, including this cover page and the prayers for your use on page three.

At one point, the disciples asked Jesus plainly, "Lord, teach us to pray." He gave them the Lord's Prayer. Since then, people of faith have been praying in expanding ways.

One way to pray that I learned I have shared before. It's praying the way of the cross. With the words, "Take up your cross and follow me," fresh on my mind, it made sense to re-share this method of prayer for this Lent and always. The numbers on the picture of the cross represent the order of this prayer, from the top of the cross as #1 to the left arm of the cross at #5. Note: prayers for ourselves are last!



To say more, it goes like this. There are different types of prayer, principally adoration, praise, thanksgiving, penitence, oblation, intercession, and petition. The Catechism on page 856 of the Book of Common Prayer outlines all this.

At the top of the cross, the part that points heavenward, are prayers of Adoration, Praise, and Thanksgiving. Adoration is the lifting up of the heart and mind to God, asking nothing but to enjoy God's presence. We praise God, not to obtain anything, but because God's Being draws praise from us. Thanksgiving is offered to God for all the blessings of this life, for our redemption, and for whatever draws us closer to God. Start at #1, the top of the cross, with these prayers.

Step #2, the earthly end of the cross, come prayers of penitence, in which we confess our sins and make restitution where possible, with the intention to amend our lives.

At the center of the cross, position #3, where Jesus offered himself for our sins, we make Oblation, an offering of ourselves, our lives and labors, in union with Christ, for the purposes of God.

On the right arm of the cross, position #4, we pray for others. These are called intercessions, much like the prayers of the people on Sundays are intercessions. Think and pray for all the other people out there besides you, and pray for them.

Lastly, at position #5, the left arm of the cross, is petition, in which we present our own needs, that God's will may be done.

Take 10-15 minutes each day, quiet your mind and heart for a moment, ask the Spirit to guide you, and use this prayer. I hope you will find it draws you closer to God and helps you to consider all the matters of life that ask our prayers.


